### School Streets – Can You Help Make Our Neighbourhood Safer for All?

School Streets restricts traffic in roads near schools to help young people and families stay safe on their journeys to and from school. Hessle Penshurst primary school are urgently looking for volunteer marshals to support the School Streets initiative – volunteers are crucial to the scheme's success as they help motorists understand the restrictions, and explain what's going on in a friendly, polite and positive way.

#### Do you want to:

- Make a difference in your community?
- Volunteer outside on a regular basis?
- Help young people stay safe as they walk, cycle or scoot to school?
- Receive training and develop workplace skills, such as communication skills?

#### The main roles of a School Streets volunteer marshal are to:

- Set up and pack down the portable temporary traffic restriction signage
- Inform drivers of the restriction; offering information and guidance (for example, highlighting the location of the park and stride areas if applicable)
- Help explain the reasons for School Streets to passers-by and drivers if asked; assist vehicles which have a permit or are on the exemption list on entering the School Streets zone

We need volunteers for up to one hour each morning and up to one hour in the afternoon, during term time – flexible volunteering across a team of people is encouraged, so please get in touch if you could volunteer for one or two days per week.
