Customers in East Riding of Yorkshire among Britain's top energy switchers

Customers in the East Riding of Yorkshire are among Great Britain's top energy switchers, with one in four of them changing their supplier in 2020, new figures have revealed.

The figures, published by Energy UK's Energy Switch Guarantee, show that the East Riding of Yorkshire is second in a table of the top areas in Great Britain for the most energy switching activity last year.

The local authority rankings are ordered by the percentage of properties that switched electricity supplier between January and December 2020.


Last year, East Riding of Yorkshire Council's YORSwitch scheme switched 5,234 households, saving East Riding residents more than £1million.

Since the scheme began in 2013, YORSwitch has helped more than 36,000 households switch their energy tariffs, with savings of over £7.6 million.

The YORSwitch round opens for registrations on Tuesday 3 August, with an auction held between suppliers on Tuesday 12 October, then with the opportunity to switch to the winning supplier, until late November 2021.

Councillor Chris Matthews, portfolio holder for environment and climate change at East Riding of Yorkshire Council, said: "Residents still have time to register for the latest YORSwitch round. Now is the best time to fix your energy tariff. Switching through YORSwitch, to the winning supplier which is Shell Energy, is expected to save residents money in the long term."

For the 2nd year running we were unable to hold the Humber Bridge Sportive, and consequently, our charities again missed out on an estimated £20,000. In an attempt to salvage something from the disappointing cancellation, I had what I thought was an excellent fundraising idea - to ride from Morecambe to Bridlington, otherwise known as the Way of The Roses. What's more, I reckoned it would be more of a challenge to ride the 170 miles in 1 day fool!! As reality began to bite, the enormity of the challenge started to take on worrying proportions!

Co-founder of the HBS and cycling guru, Andy Cawley, signed up/had his arm twisted for the ride; we were also joined by Paul Spence, a man who can never say no to a challenge, together with another 4 intrepid/mad - take your pick cyclists! Our aim was to split the monies raised 3 ways:- P.A.U.L for Brain Recovery, Macmillan Cancer Care in Yorkshire, and Emmaus Hull.

170 miles and over 9,000 feet of elevation was unchartered

territory for most of us, but spurred on by the fear of not accomplishing what we had set out to do, and motivated by a terrific spirit within the group, not forgetting our support drivers, Paul and Jim, we rolled onto the North Promenade in Brid having spent a total of 11 hours 1 minute on the bike, consumed an outrageous number of calories, and suffered not 1 single puncture!

I'll be extremely careful in future to keep ridiculous ideas to myself, but nonetheless, thanks to the generosity of the local business

community, the amazing support of friends and family, this ride generated a whopping £6,600, which for sure made the sweat, tears, and some blood, all worthwhile!! We are looking forward to presenting our charities with the proceeds, and can be sure that the money will be put to good use as they continue to do amazing work within our community.

East Riding of Yorkshire Community Tree Grant

following the success of last year's application the Town Council will be applying for another grant - if successful, the funding will be used to plant trees in Hessle. The decision on suitable areas is made in conjunction with ERYC officers and it is hoped that re-planting will go some way to replace the trees which have been lost through development.

Litterati Group

The Town Council have provided the Litterati group with stickers which are placed on the bags of litter members have collected. Upon collection this makes them clearly identifiable to ERYC, which then helps them identify bags which have been fly tipped and require further investigation by Street scene Enforcement.

Litter Bins

Floral Displays

Over the coming months the Town Council will be looking at expanding the floral displays in the Town, with the installation of new planters.

Margaret has knitted a whopping 470 poppies and Joyce has been busy filling her days in isolation, following a period of hospitalisation by knitting for us. We understand from speaking to residents that this project has been a welcome distraction over the last 16 months and has helped many people get through the periods of lockdown and isolation

It is hoped that this installation will be on display outside the Town Hall from the beginning of November.



DOG FOULING - PICK IT UP AND BIN IT!

The Town Council are forever receiving complaints from residents concerned about the amount of Dog poo which is not picked up by dog owners. It is an offence not to pick up and responsibly dispose of your dog's waste – You could be looking at a fine of up to £75.00, under the Public Spaces Protection Orders if youdon't!

The Town Council are advising all residents to stay vigilant and report any know culprits to the Dog Wardens at East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) – who I can tell you are very proactive!

The Council also receive complaints of dog waste bags being slung into bushes and trees – to hang there forever- The Town Council are funding and placing litter bins around Hessle, in an effort to put a stop to this activity!

If you have any suggestions for litter bins – please contact the Council and they will consider the request. The Town Council also have the Doggy 'Clean it up' stencils and yellow paint to borrow – just pop into the office.



DOGS ON I FADS / DOG FXCI USION

The Town Council have received complaints that some owners are failing to comply with the Public Space Protection Orders, allowing their dogs to be off leads in church yards and cemeteries and to enter children's play areas – which are dog exclusion zones.

Failure to comply with Public Spaces Protection orders may result in a £75.00 fine.
