#### a) Boothferry Road Safety

To receive the response received from ERYC Traffic Management to our letter addressed to Mr Stephen Hunt regarding safety along Boothferry Road discussed at the meeting in December.

**RESOLVED** that the Clerk responds to the Traffic Management team to thank them for their comments and appreciate that this was not raised back in 2018 for one planning application. However, there has been a significant number of properties built in Hessle since 2018 especially on the North side of Boothferry Road, including the new St. Annes school and the 44 apartment extra care housing facility. Whilst Hessle Town Council would like to encourage parents walking children to school, with the potential of a further 340+ homes on land allocated for development in the revised local plan (HES-J), Boothferry Road is now a cause for concern because of the residents with young children that have moved into these new homes and those that potentially will in the future. The Town Council will diarise this item in order to monitor the situation and will revisit this again in 6 months' time.

### b) Hessle Foreshore Flood Alerts

To discuss the situation and procedures that are currently in place at the foreshore following flood warnings from the Environment Agency and ERYC closing the new gates. (Bovill/Chair)

**RESOLVED** that the Clerk contacts ERYC to ascertain what the protocol is when flood alerts are sent out and who has the keys and when will the gates be closed on the new defence wall.

## c) Southfield Conservation Area Group

## a) <u>Cliff Road – proposed waiting, parking & loading restrictions</u>

**RESOLVED** that Hessle Town Council concurs with the residents along Cliff Road with regards to the proposal of changing the double yellow lines to No waiting, loading or unloading along the stretch of road mentioned in the correspondence. This would be particularly helpful for the Humber Rescue crew who have seen an increase in incidents at the bridge over the last 2 years when they have needed to get to the lifeboat in an emergency and have been unable to because of parked vehicles blocking their access. It would also be helpful if this could be backed up by regular patrols by ERYC Traffic Enforcement Officers, especially during the summer months and at weekends and the Clerk will respond to the East Riding Traffic Management Department confirming our support for the residents proposals and comments.
