133913 HESSLE STATION FOOTBRIDGE REPLACEMENT – STORY CONTRACTING LTD

Mr Matthew Whittaker (Project Agent) and Mr Dan Jones (Operations Director) from Story Contracting Ltd attended the meeting to discuss the replacement of the footbridge at Hessle Station in late 2023. They provided drawings in order to give an idea of the project plan and discussed building relationships with the local community and any opportunities or volunteer days that Story Contracting could offer that could benefit the local area. Mr Withers spoke and indicated that Hessle Station is the first station on the Wold's Way and is historic with both the Victorian canopy and footbridge and whilst they realise the footbridge is in a dilapidated state, Hessle Town Council feel that the aesthetic value of the existing Victorian footbridge should be kept, especially as the Station is in one of the most important Hessle Conservation Areas (Southfield) and asked Story Construction if they could as well as futureproofing, redesign the bridge to have all the modern capabilities but with the original Victorian look? The Council also asked if the replacement footbridge would be

high enough to enable electrification to be installed at a later date, as this is a major ongoing struggle with the Government involving local MP's, Business groups and Partnerships to electrify the railway line to Hull and the Town Council are concerned that if Northern Rail spend money now on replacement bridges that are not fit for electrification capabilities, then they will argue that there is no funding left in later years if electrification is agreed. With regards to community opportunities and volunteer days, Mr Withers and the Clerk both mentioned that one project Hessle Town Council have been trying to get the East Riding Council to address for a number of years unsuccessfully, is the state of Footpath No.1, 'The Baulk', between Woodfield Lane and Cliff Road near to the Station and which is in a dreadful state and desperately needs tidying up and Story Construction could have a look at undertaking this as a project for the area. Mr Jones asked if the Town Council would send these comments and details in an email to Mr Whittaker in order that they can then discuss the scheme further with Network Rail before any decisions and plans are finalised. 8.15pm The Chairman, members present and the Clerk thanked Mr Whittaker and Mr Jones for taking the time to contact the Town Council and for attending the meeting. The Clerk will forward the information discussed to them and they will contact us again in due course.

133917 TRAFFIC MATTERS:

a) First Lane/Bethune Avenue junction

Following the meeting in November, Committee to receive the response from Ben Gilligan, the Managing Director at East Yorkshire Motor Services confirming that his team/drivers have provided feedback to him confirming that they have no major concerns or problems with the EYMS buses travelling along First Lane or at the Bethune Avenue junction.

b) Traffic Regulation Order - Redcliff Road

d) Hessle – Cycle Parking

Following the Town Council's response to the ERYC LTP programme for secure Cycle Parking areas in Hessle in June, a detailed response has now been received and if the Town Council have any alternative locations, they would be happy to investigate these. (Chair/Bovill)

RESOLVED to receive the response from ERYC and the Clerk is to respond with the Committees disappointment that more robust cycle parking facilities were not considered, such as those at Ferriby Train Station. The Clerk will also suggest if an area in The Square could be investigated.

e) Speed Survey - Hull Road

Following the discussions at the October meeting and a resident providing further information regarding the problems being experienced along Hull Road, Councillor Bovill would like Hessle Town Council to consider requesting if ERYC would be able to conduct two speed surveys along Hull Road, one between Eastgate and the Square and another between Itlings Lane and Buttfield Road.

RESOLVED that in the first instance, the Clerk will write to the ERYC Traffic & Parking Department to request a Speed Survey be undertaken along Hull Road between the zebra crossing outside The Grange Medical Centre and Buttfield Road roundabout where the incidents of speeding are noticeably increasing in what should be a 20mph zone, especially in the evenings. The Clerk is also to request if a Speed Survey could also be undertaken along First Lane, following the recent incident of a child being knocked over, between the pinch point south to Winthorpe Road.

f) <u>Traffic Regulation Order – Westfield Rise</u>

To receive details of the Traffic Regulation Order for Westfield Rise. The road will be closed from 23rd January 2023 to allow for carriageway resurfacing works to be carried out in safety. It is anticipated that the works will take no longer than 26 days to complete and working hours will be between 09.00 and 15.30. (Padden/Chair)
